


ARCHAEOLOGICAL RIDDLES

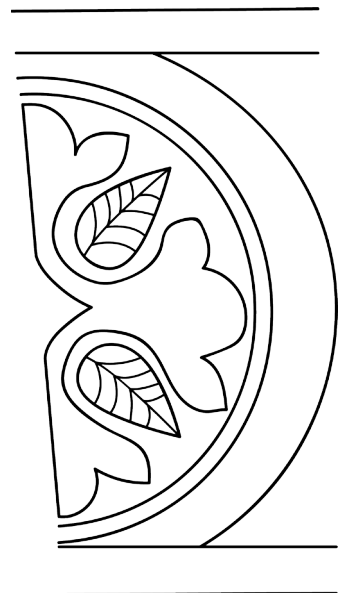
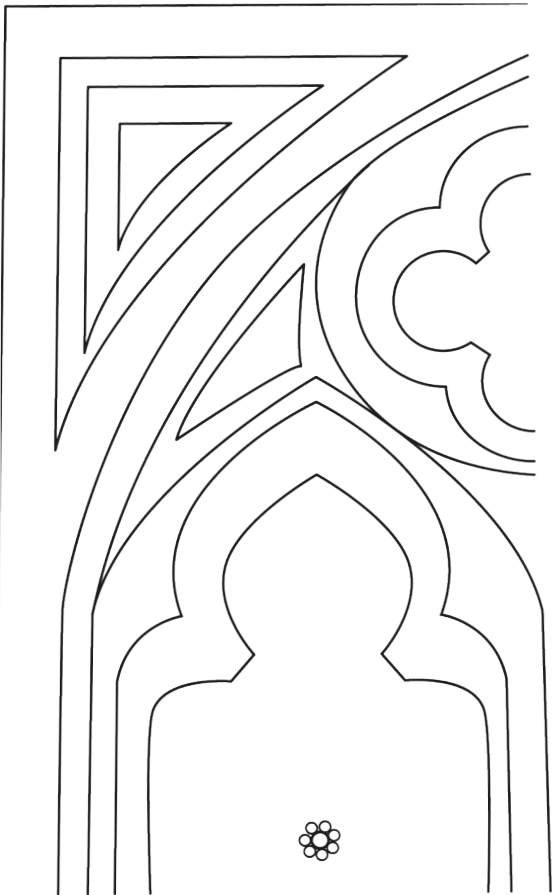
Task 1
